MESSAGE







by Valérie Tellier, presented at the Executive Board meeting of 16 January 2023

Gentlemen Members of the Board, Mr. President of the Communauté de Communes (Association of district councils) Mr. Roussel, Ladies and Gentlemen representatives of the Communauté de Communes des Villes Soeurs, ladies and gentlemen, dear partners and members: firstly thank you for being here in such numbers.

In 2022, declared the Year of Glass by the UN, we developed a range of excellent initiatives to promote and raise the profile of our association.

We created the **Special Edition Formes de Luxe**, a 5,000-copy run handed out at all Luxe Pack and PCD shows, thanks to the businesses that provided financial support.

The commissioning of the book "le Feu Sacré" (Sacred Fire) from Francis Dréer, on the history of glass in our valley, which is still available for sale in bookshops, from the Éditions Bathysphere site or the Association, the internet site, which has been completely overhauled for greater visibility and ease of use, I think you've all been to take a look at it, our "Glass Night" event of the 24th of November, which was an evening filled with information-sharing and future challenges, connecting the history of our trades with a future that poses major challenges in terms of decarbonisation.

Once again, all the businesses involved in the roundtables provided financial support for this project. Thanks to each of their contributions, we were able to hand out a gift at the end of the Glass Night. Thank you all, as absolutely everyone put in a huge amount of work on this.

On behalf of La Glass Vallée, I'd like to thank Sylvie Narbey, who supported us throughout these initiatives to shine a spotlight on our association.

La Glass Vallée was at the Fêno a ("Best of Normandy") festival with an exhibition of glass creations, thanks to the businesses who entrusted us with their bottles. While at Fêno, I was invited to take part in a roundtable on the difficulties faced by our businesses in response to soaring energy costs; a joint letter has also been addressed to the relevant Prefects of our production sites, detailing our concerns around the issue of energy. As for the initiative commonly known as "HR", our association took part in the various initiatives led by the Agence Régionale de l'Orientation (Regional Training Agency), at the Métiers en tournée (Touring Trades Fair), and the Forum pour l'emploi (Job Fair).

Extensive discussions with the Pôle Emploi employment centre around our difficulties in recruitment. There's a lot of work still to do. I won't list all of the various initiatives, or the many events we've been invited to and attended, but 2022 was as eventful and intensive a year for us as it was for the businesses we represent.

I would very much like to thank the Executive Board for the work they've done throughout this year. And that work continues, as we in the association need each other now more than ever to keep making ourselves known and recognised for the excellence of our respective trades. On behalf of the Executive Board, our thanks go to Pochet, who, believe it or not, are celebrating their 400th year in business, for this wonderful event where we're gathered today. I keep telling myself how fortunate we all are, as businesses and trades, to be able to endure despite the crises and continually reinvent ourselves to meet the needs of our prestigious clients. Between us, and in front of everyone here, I'd like to congratulate Stéphanie Tourres from Waltersperger, who represented the Haute-Normandie region at the Élysée Palace for the major exhibition "Fabriqué en France" (Made in France). However, it was our industry as a whole that was showcased at the event, thanks to the Guerlain Shalimar bottle.

We worked on the 2023-2025 three-

year plan with the Normandy region and the yearly plan with the Hauts-de-France region. Thank you to Oriane who is here today and Laurent for their support throughout the year. Thanks for your trust and also the work you've done. We must also continue our efforts on recognition: you are all invited to our event scheduled for the 30th of November and we expect to see you all there. It will be held at Saint-Valéry-sur-Somme, in the salt storehouses. The programme is currently being drawn up. Regarding the CSR policy: "être plus vert, c'est la mode" (being greener is on-trend). My special request to the glass-makers, who aren't so well-represented this evening, is to ask the companies they work with to join us, in order to strengthen our CSR policy and be in a position to look at introducing a joint CSR initiative. Our recruitment issues demand a decisive response: the promotion of our trades and the attractiveness of our region, an initiative around the former Glassmaking Traditions Museum, on augmented reality which is already underway, but also that we reflect, have young people in study at our businesses to give them a better understanding of what we do and perhaps adapt ourselves to them. The recently started construction on the Penly EPR nuclear site may be an opportunity for many, but to my mind it will only contribute to even greater pressure on our jobs. I'm very much looking forward to the collaboration



we're hoping to implement and showcase with the combined history of our museum and that of Blangy, and the future with our new offices on the site of the former Glassmaking Traditions Museum.

On the subject of innovation, it's worth mentioning that strong partnerships do exist between some businesses, but once again, we must go much further and look to external advice if we want our SMEs to keep growing. A partnership has started and will need to be maintained with the Energy sector around this clearly defined, yet highly technical theme, and we now have our lobbyist Mr Vincent Desjonguères, working on energy-related subjects. There has been strong cooperation with our banking partners and I thank them. Crédit Agricole, which has worked with us from the start and then Caisse d'Épargne since 2022. Now, a subject was brought up to me this morning and I feel it would be a good idea to put it to you, particularly with all the work that's being done with Kiwai in La Glass Vallée.

Thank you all for your consistent support throughout the year. We have commissioned a study on the possibility of bringing everything we represent in terms of jobs, products manufactured, but also exports, in-house within our association.

Mrs Yamina Orizoli left for retirement on the 30th of June. We need to re-examine how our administrative and accounting functions are organised.

Lastly, I'd like to take this opportunity in the final year of my term, and seeing as this is my umpteenth General Assembly, to share with you the work that the association requires and is much needed, that each member of the office takes responsibility for specific subjects to make further progress, but also to prepare for my successor.

Remember: this is your association and it's up to you to keep it going.

A first this year with the introduction of breakfast meetings at the Domaine de Joinville in the 1st half of 2023.

- Reeniu - February 2023

As part of the current energy transition policy, aimed at reducing energy consumption, our carbon footprint and the various types of pollution, and more generally to drive industry forward towards more efficient and greener production. Its director Pascal Ballon came to introduce his measurement tool to the members of La Glass Vallée.

- AD Normandie - March 2023

The Just Transition Fund is a new financial instrument resulting from the European Green Deal, which is part of the European Union's socio-economic and territorial Cohesion Policy. It aims to mitigate the socio-economic cost associated with the transition towards climate neutrality in the worst-affected territories. In Normandy, it targets the Seine and Bresle Valley areas. Jean-Christophe Laloup came to talk about which initiatives are eligible for this fund and how it can be accessed.

- DDETS de la Somme (Somme Departmental Employment and Labour Authority) - March 2023

Representing the Hauts-de-France region, Joël Vandemoëre et Stéphanie Vandamme outlined the role and responsibilities of Délégués à l'Accompagnement des Reconversions Professionnelles (Professional Retraining Support Representatives - DDARP); as well as the existing recruitment schemes to respond to needs and shortages in the employment catchment area (e.g. Pôle Emploi, Proch'Emploi, APEC, hiring of apprentices and focus on energy support and the green transition).

- Normandie Énergie - May 2023

La Glass Vallée and Normandie Énergie, partners in a half-day of workshops revolving around the issue of energy efficiency.

- Key points and examples of initiatives to optimise, recover and reuse waste heat via ORC modules, feedback and financing, etc.
- A workshop on solar energy.
- Background, regulatory changes and Renewable Energy Acceleration Law, including feedback plus the funding available from ADN and banking partners. A breakfast meeting that was a resounding success, thanks to Valérie Rai-Punsola and her teams.









To highlight a just a few:

The new Waltersperger site by the Deputy Prefect of Dieppe, the President of the Blangysur-Bresle Inter-regional Community of Communes (CCIAB), and the mayor of Blangy-sur-Bresle.

A visit of the **Pochet du Courval** glass production and finishing plants by the Prefect and Deputy Prefect.

A visit of the **Vallaquage** and **Inserdeco** companies by the Regional Director of Public Finances and the Seine-Maritime département.

The official opening of SGD Pharma's new siliconising production line.

Also an invitation to **Michelin** to visit the businesses of La Glass Vallée and provide feedback on their level of innovation and robotisation. A day was devoted to their visit. Thanks to Vallaquage, Pochet du Courval and SGD Pharma for their time and their warm welcome.







Valérie Tellier, as President, attended a range of different events. In particular, she was invited to the **World Peace Forum**, to the **Fête de la Pomme (Apple Festival)** where she spoke on the subject of decarbonisation, to **the official opening of the Cabalet sawmill**, a new member of La Glass Vallée, as well as the **Paris Journée de La Beauté (Beauty Day)**, organised by CEW.





But La Glass Vallée's initiatives don't stop there. In fact, the Association is regularly invited to continuing events such as:

- The meetings of the Catef held twice-yearly at the office of the Deputy Prefect of Dieppe,
- Weekly meetings with the Agence de l'Orientation training agency (GT Industries),
- Local industry meetings introduced by the Hauts-de-France Chamber of Commerce and Industry (CCI) and the Somme Deputy Prefect's office, attended by businesses, inter-authority players, economic partners and State operators.
- Inter-sectoral clubs organised by AD Normandie, with this year's themes and workshops revolving around innovation, the Just Transition Fund, the Normandie Talents local departmental initiative, cybersecurity and exports.



Elsewhere, Normandie Attractivité invites its partners to get to know each other by organising site visits, including those to Decathlon, the "supply web" at Démouville and Cireve: a cross-disciplinary virtual reality centre at Caen, to give just a few examples.

As an "Ambassador for Normandy" on the theme of local Employment and Attractiveness, La Glass Vallée is also involved in the sharing of strategic export advice at regional level.





La Glass Vallée also attended meetings held by the Dieppe Deputy Prefect's office on the subject of the company Sival and a "speed dating" event in which several members took part.

LA GLASS VALLÉE - ANNUAL REPORT 2023



A number of meetings and initiatives took place on the subject of the acquisition of the Museum of Glassmaking Traditions until the association was dissolved. A strategic committee has been put together consisting of Valérie Tellier, Xavier Breuvart, Benoit Marszalek, France Desjonquères, Thomas Godart, Christian Mettelle and Stéphane Franconville, with the aim of setting out the roadmap and optimising this historic heritage as best possible, presenting a modern and dynamic image of our industry through innovative tools such as augmented reality, virtual reality or artificial intelligence, thus working on the future.

Meetings are planned with the Strategic Committee, which will hear proposals by 3 specialist agencies in early December. La Glass Vallée has returned to Normandy and is now located in the former Museum of Glassmaking Traditions. Very comfortable premises, fully renovated by the technical departments of the Town Council and funded entirely by the Museum association. Thanks to them.

Extra High Voltage Lines

Below is the cartographic overview of the zone of least impact, approved by the local consultation body at its meeting in Woincourt on 20 September under the chairmanship of the Prefect of the Somme Rollon Mouchel-Blaisot, who is responsible for coordinating the project for the State and the Deputy Prefect of Dieppe, Pascal Vion, acting for the Prefect of Seine-Maritime and in the presence of elected officials, consular chambers and associations.


This made it possible to establish the zone of least impact for the construction of the new overhead power line.

The body also fixed the location for a new



substation, replacing the existing substation at Beauchamps.

The new line will follow the current 400 kV power line already in service for 2/3 of its route, crossing the Somme at Hangest-sur-Somme and Bresle at Beauchamps. The route chosen makes it possible to avoid peri-urban areas. The reconstruction of the Beauchamps substation will strengthen the electrical safety of the area, while 55 km of the 225 kV line between Amiens and Beauchamps will be completely removed.


Overview of Offices and Executive Boards










Quantitative indicators for initiatives implemented by La Glass Vallée in 2023


